## IUPAP Commission Chairs and Council Meeting (Taipei, Taiwan) October 2016 Secretary General's Report for 2016

### 1. Finance

The financial statement for last year (2015) is included along with the performance against budget this year (2016) and the proposed budget for next year (2017), all of which will be covered in more detail under a separate agenda item.
